Find The Friend

Material

- Paper bags
- Images of faces
- 2 images of David's face

Steps

- 1. Before class, place all the different faces except David's in individual bags. The idea is that they can't know which face is in which bag.
- 2. Place the bags on a table in front of the children.
- 3. Tell the children that Jonathan was David's friend and that they lost sight of each other.
- 4. Explain that in each of the bags, there is a different face, but they have to find David's face. You can show them the other image of David's face so they know who they are looking for.
- 5. Start by asking a child what bag he thinks David is in. Show the face in the bag.
- 6. If it's David, rejoice that they've found Jonathan's friend. If it's another face, let another child guess for another bag.
- 7. Continue until David's face is found.
- 8. Make the connection with the story of the Bible. David was Jonathan's friend.

Object Lesson

Friends Do Lots Of Fun Things

Material

- Bow
- Arrow

Steps

- 1. Explain to the children that it is important to be a good friend.
- 2. Show the bow and arrow.
- 3. Explain to the children that David and Jonathan were friends and that they loved to share.
- 4. Recite and mime the rhyme. Encourage the children to do the gestures with you.

Nursery Rhyme

- Friends do lots of fun things (Extend your hands with your palms facing upwards.)
- They love each other, talk to each other and sometimes they sing (Show the heart, then the mouth; move your hands as if to lead a song.)
- Listen, help, learn and share
 - (Place a funnel-shaped hand around the ear; extend one hand, show the head; extend the hands joined by the side, palms facing upwards.)
- Doing these things together is friendship.
 (Extend your hands; fold your arms to hug yourself.)

Craft

Friendship Bracelets

Material

- Toilet paper rolls
- Stickers
- Coloured pencils
- Scissors

Steps

- 1. Give each child a toilet paper roll, making sure the roll fits well around the child's wrist. If not, use scissors to adjust it.
- 2. Ask the children to decorate the roll with stickers and coloured pencils.





Activity

Help Jonathan Find David

Material

- · Quinoa seeds
- Magnetic objects (trombones, small refrigerator magnets, clothespins, etc.)
- Non-magnetic objects (gums, elastics, dice, figurines, etc.)
- Plastic bin
- Magnetic wand

Steps

- 1. Before class, fill the plastic tray with quinoa grains. Place all the objects in it. You can hide some objects in quinoa and let others overtake.
- 2. After telling the story of the day, give the magnetic wand to a first child and tell him or her to use it to find a magnetic object.
- 3. Let each child, in turn, look for a magnetic object.
- 4. Make the connection with the story, the magnetic object representing Jonathan's friend: David.

Optional

- You can use rice, pasta, sand or salt.
- To help children, you can put more magnetic objects in the bin.

Physical Activity

Start The Message

Material

White paper

Steps

- 1. Make paper airplanes. Ask the children to do so if they are able.
- 2. Ask the children to throw the paper plane.
- 3. Make the connection with the story. In the Bible, Jonathan sent an arrow to leave a message for David. Explain how the plane is like the arrow Jonathan used.





Snack

Arrow

Material

- Strawberries
- Pretzels

Steps

- 1. Before class, prepare the strawberries by hulling them. Also cut half of the strawberries into a "V" shape.
- 2. Ask the children to insert a pretzel into the strawberry to represent the tip of the arrow.
- 3. Then tell them to insert a V-shaped strawberry at the other end of the pretzel. These are the feathers of the arrow.
