## Trigger

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### Joseph In The Well

#### Material

- 1 empty tin can (watch out for cuts)
- 1 figurine of a little man



#### Steps

1. Place the children in a circle.
2. Take turns asking them to try to drop the man inside the can. They must stand upright and drop the man into the can.
3. Make a connection with the story you'll be telling. In the Bible, there is a story in which a man has been thrown into a hole... but it was by his brothers.

#### Steps

## The Heart of the Father

### & Prayer

Joseph the great dreamer - what can we learn from him? So many things... Joseph had great faith in God and he knew that if God showed him something, it would happen. He had learned to recognize when God spoke to him. In his case, it was often through dreams. Not only did God give him dreams for his own life, but he also gave him the ability to explain the dreams of others and in this way tell them what God wanted to let them know.



Do you know how to hear God's voice? Do you know when God wants to talk to you? God the Father wants to talk to us, but the problem is that too often one is not attentive to his voice or simply we do not know how to recognize it. One of the ways God the father wants to talk to you is by giving you dreams in the night. When you remember your dream when you wake up, tell mom or dad and ask them if they think God wanted to talk to you. He may want to talk to you through a dream.

#### Prayer

"Father, help me hear your voice, help me recognize it. I want to talk to you and I want to hear your voice. Amen."

## Craft

### Joseph's Coat

#### Material

- Joseph's coat template (attachment)
- Tissue or construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue sticks



#### Steps

1. Print the model of Joseph's coat (attached piece) for each child and cut them all out.
2. Cut small squares in construction paper or tissue paper.
3. When doing the craft, give each child a model of the coat.
4. Place the rest of the material on the table.
5. Ask the children to glue the little squares on Joseph's coat.
6. Finally, ask them to glue the coat on a nice construction paper.

## Activity

### Put The Coat On Joseph

#### Material

- Image of Joseph without a coat
- Image of Joseph's coat
- Blu Tack



#### Steps

1. Place the image of Joseph without a coat on a wall using the Blu Tack.
2. Place the children in a row in front of Joseph's image. Keep a distance.
3. Give Joseph's coat to the first child in line.
4. Ask the child to put the coat on Joseph.
5. Then, when he is finished, tell him to bring the coat back so that the next child can, in turn, try to place the coat on Joseph.
6. Continue until all the children have tried.

## Physical Activity

### Joseph's Attic

#### Material

- Rice Krispies
- 4 large bowls
- 2 spoons



#### Steps

1. Organize a simple obstacle course in which children must carry food as quickly as possible: Rice Krispies.
2. Arrange 2 bowls at each end of the room. At one end, place cereal in the bowls, but at the other end of the room, leave the bowls empty. The goal will be to transfer the cereal from one bowl to another.
3. Divide the children into two teams and place them in line.
4. At your signal, the first child of each team must take a spoonful of cereal, start from the starting point (1st bowl of cereal) and go to the 2nd bowl to place the cereal. He must then bring the spoon back to the next child.
5. The second child does the same thing.
6. The first team to carry all the cereal will be the winner.

## Snack

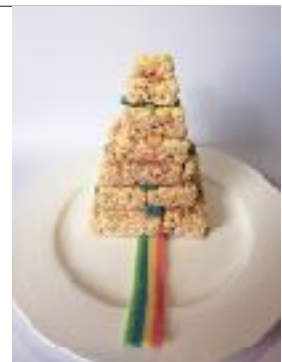
### Joseph: From Pirson To Palace

#### Material

- Puffed rice squares
- Sour candy
- Large plate

#### Steps

1. Before class, prepare a pyramid of puffed rice.
2. Add the details with the sour candy
3. Tell the children to come and take a piece of the pyramid to eat it.
4. Remind them that Joseph stayed in Egypt.



## Joseph's Coat

### Material

- Fruit Roll Ups (Fruit-O-Long)
- Big pretzels
- Small pretzels
- Ritz Crackers



### Steps

1. Ask the children to use a large pretzel for the body.
2. Ask the children to use 2 small pretzels for the arms and 2 small ones for the legs.
3. A Ritz cracker becomes the head.
4. Ask each child to cut their Fruit-O-Long into strips to form Joseph's coat, then place the coat on the large pretzel.
5. Enjoy.

### Optional

Use this same snack when teaching children to wear clothes of praise (Isaiah 61:3) or Aaron's sacred clothes (Exodus 28).
