The Manna From Heaven

Material

- Foam pom-poms or cotton balls
- Styrofoam cups (Polystyrene)



Steps

1. Give each child 1 styrofoam cup. Tell them that they will have to fill it with objects that will come down from heaven. The child whose cup will be full first will be the winner.
2. Then throw the foam pom-poms or the cotton balls in the air. Be sure to throw them in different areas of the classroom.
3. At your signal, children can start picking up the “manna.”
4. When the game is over, tell the children that there is a story in the Bible where the Israelites also had to pick up something that came down from heaven. It was their food... Start the story.

Steps

1. Show the illustrations and ask children to hold them.
2. While you are repeating each line of the rhyme, ask a volunteer to show the illustration.

Nursery Rhyme

The Heart of the Father

& Prayer

Moses did not have an easy life: it was filled with difficulties. Not long after he was born, the king ordered the killing of the baby boys. To save his life, his mother laid him in a basket and put him on the river and then the Pharaoh's daughter rescued him. Much of Moses' life was like this, he experienced difficulties, but each time the Father delivered him. He is an example of faith and trust in God, a good example to follow.



Are you going through some difficult things this morning? Are you rejected by someone? Are you dealing with huge problems, like the separation of your parents, the death of someone that was close to you, etc.? Through all that he lived, Moses chose to put his trust in God the Father and he was rewarded for it. After seeing his people suffer for 40 years, he saw them delivered. He was visited by God on the mountain and received from Him the 10 commandments. He lived the glory of God in his life.

Moses is no different from you. If you put your trust in God the Father, you too will live and see great things and you will see the glory of God in your life. You will see the Father work in the most difficult situations of your life, you will receive a peace in your heart that no one can give you. You're going to get a joy that no one can give you.

Ministry Time

We will take time alone with the Father this morning and we will give him the difficult situations we are going through. We're going to give him the hard things we're going through right now. Then for those who wish, we will make the decision to trust him and let him work in our hearts and in the difficult situations of our lives.

Give children time to talk to the Father, to have a heart to heart with him.

Prayer

"Father, you see all the difficult situations in my life, you see the things that hurt me, I give them to you this morning. Father I need your help, I need you to help me through this difficulty in my life. I need to know and feel that you're here with me and that you're walking with me like you did with Moses. Give me peace to get through these trials! I choose to put my trust in you and let you work in my life and in the lives of the people around me. Amen. »

Craft

Pillar Of Cloud, Pillar Of Fire

Material

- Paper towel rolls (2 per child)
- Red, orange and yellow tissue paper
- Cotton balls
- Glue



Steps

1. Distribute 2 paper towel rolls to every child.
2. Ask them to glue cotton balls on the first paper towel roll. It's the pillar of cloud.
3. Then ask them to glue crumpled squares of tissue paper on the rolls. It's the pillar of fire.
4. Make the connection with the story of the day.

Activity

Find The Plague Of Egypt

Memory Game

Material

- 20 cardboard plates
- Images of water in blood
- Images of frogs
- Images of mosquitoes or lice
- Images of flies
- Images of herds of dead animals
- Images of boils
- Images of hail
- Images of grasshoppers
- Images of darkness
- Images of dead firstborn



Steps

1. Before class, print 2 of all ten images.
2. Then glue each image inside a cardboard plate.
3. Place each plate upside down in the classroom.
4. Ask the children to find the two similar images.
5. Remind the children that they are finding the plagues of Egypt.

Physical Activity

Separate The Sea In Two

Material

- 1 pack of blue balloons
- Garbage bags

Steps

1. Before the class begins, inflate several blue balloons and place them in large garbage bags.
2. When it is time to play, take out the balloons and place them on the floor in the middle of the class.
3. Divide the children into 2 groups and tell them that they will divide the sea in two.
4. At your signal, they must take a balloon and carry it as quickly as possible in a place provided for this purpose for their group.
5. They have to repeat the task until there are no balloons left. The group with the most blue balloons will win.

Snack

Burning Bush

Material

- Cupcakes
- Vanilla icing
- Yellow and red food colouring
- Pastry (icing) bag
- Pastry (icing) bag with star shaped tip (# 19 in the example)
- 3 bowls
- Spatula or butter knife



Steps

1. Prepare snacks before class.
2. Bake the cupcakes of the flavor of your choice by following the instructions on the package and let them cool completely.
3. Then divide the vanilla icing evenly into three bowls.
4. Add red food colouring in a bowl, one bowl yellow and one bowl orange (by combining red and yellow food colouring).
5. Place the star tip in the bag with all three colours. To do this, use an icing spatula or butter knives to put each colour of icing in the bag in a thick strip. When you are done, you should have three sections of icing inside the bag. Don't worry if one part of a colour mixes with another colour. As long as there are three distinct colours inside the bag, it will work.
6. Now place the tip directly down on the surface in the middle of the cupcake. With a slight pressure, press and let the icing build up to a slight base, then gently pull up, releasing the pressure.
7. Continue to make "flames" all over the surface of the cupcake. Make some long flames and some short ones. Make them overlap each other.
8. Give each child a cupcake and make a connection with the story of the day. Moses saw a burning bush.

Optional

- For 24 cupcakes, two containers of icing are sufficient.
- You can also break mini pretzels to create the branches of the bush.
