The Colours Of The Rainbow...

Material

- None

Steps

1. Tell the children that you are making a riddle in which they will discover the significance of the rainbow between God and men.
 - Take the third letter of the colour of a carrot. (orange – a)
 - Take the second letter of the colour of the sky. (blue – l)
 - Take the third letter of the colour of a lemon. (yellow – l)
 - Take the third letter of the colour of snow. (white – i)
 - Take the third letter of the colour of coal. (black – a)
 - Take the fifth letter of the colour of grass. (green – n)
 - Take the fourth letter of the colour of a crow. (black – c)
 - Take the second letter of the colour of a strawberry. (red – e)
 - Answer: a-l-l-i-a-n-c-e – alliance
2. You can use this riddle before you start your teaching or also at the end of it. This riddle is for older children (from the 3rd year of elementary school).

Object Lesson

God Keeps His Promises

Material

- Packs of chewing gum

Steps

1. Tell a child that if he/she does 10 push-ups or something else of your choice, you promise (use the word “promise” several times during this lesson) that you will give them a pack of chewing gum.
2. After the child has done it, tell him he’s done a good job, but you’ve changed your mind and only give him one piece of gum instead of the whole package.
3. Ask another child and do the same (the children will certainly say “but you promised”). Give several “excuses” for not fulfilling your promise.
4. Then call the same children and ask them how they felt when they did everything you asked them to do, but you didn’t keep your promise? Give each child a full pack.
5. Explain that the only one who will never break his promise is Heavenly Father. Show the children a Bible and tell them that this book is full of wonderful promises and that if we do our part, He will do His, it is promised!

The Heart Of The Father

& Prayer

Noah is for us an example of faith and trust in God. God asked Noah to build a boat, a huge boat.

Genesis 6.15 describes the size of the boat. In meters it gives: 135 meters long, 23 meters wide, 14 meters high. Imagine building such a big boat without all the tools we have today. We don't know exactly how long Noah took to build the ark, but we do know that it took several years.

Why do you think Noah didn't give up along the way? There may be several reasons, but one of the reasons is that Noah knew his God and knew that God always honoured



his promises. When Noah entered the boat with the animals and his family, the rain began to fall on the earth and for 40 days it didn't stop. That's a long time, 40 days in a boat with animals and water all around you. But Noah trusted God and knew that his God would honour his promises and that one day the rain would stop and that they could all get out of the boat. God made promises to Noah and he kept them. The promises that the Father makes to you, he will fulfill them too. Even if it takes time, you must keep faith and hope and trust in God. You may be in a difficult situation right now and you're saying to yourself, "It's never going to get better." But Jeremiah 29:11 affirms "For I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord. "They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope." Then always remember that the Father is a perfect father and that he is not a man to lie. He always honours his promises.

Application

Puzzle

Write Jeremiah 29.11 on a sheet of paper and cut out all the words. The children will have to redo the verse by sticking each piece to the wall in order to redo the sentence.

Never forget that even if you are currently going through difficult things, one day it will end and you will see the sun rise over you and God the Father's plan fulfilled in you.

Craft

Magnetic Animals

Material

- Separated plastic animals (keep only the back of the animals)
- Small magnets
- Hot glue gun



Steps

1. Distribute a few separated plastic animals and a few magnets to each child.
2. Tell them to glue a magnet on the back of the animals using the hot glue to make a small refrigerator magnet.

Activity

Material

Steps

1. Have fun with the children by doing this weird animal quiz.



Physical Activity

Noah's Ark

Materiall

- White paper
- Pencil



Steps

1. Before class, prepare papers on which you write animal names: 2 cats, 2 dogs, 2 cows, etc. Make sure you have the same animal name twice.
2. Mix the papers and distribute them to the children.
3. Ask them to secretly look at their paper.
4. At your signal, they must mime and make the sound of their animal. Each child must therefore find his pair as soon as possible and come to stand in front of the ark 2 by 2.

Optional

This game can take place in several rounds by eliminating each time the last pair that was found.

Snack

The Rainbow

Material

- Slices of white bread
- Milk
- Food colouring
- Brushes



Steps

1. Pour the milk into small containers. Add several drops of food coloring of different colours in each containers and stir.
2. Give each child a slice of bread and a brush.
3. Ask them to paint their bread in the colours of the rainbow by dipping their brush in the coloured milk.
