Cry Of Animals

Material

List of animals

Steps

- 1. Prepare a list of animals whose cry is easy to imitate.
- 2. Discreetly tell each child the name of an animal whose cry they will have to imitate.
- 3. Be sure to mention the same animal to two children.
- 4. When all the children know what animal they are, give the starting signal.
- 5. At that moment, each child must imitate the cry of their animal as loudly as possible in order to find its twin.
- 6. At the end of the game, tell the children that in the story of the day, there were just two animals of each species that ended up on a huge boat.

Object Lesson

I Need To Be Protected

Material

Toy boat

Steps

- 1. Give the boat to a child.
- 2. After you've said every sentence of the rhyme, ask the child to make the boat move as if it was in a storm.
- 3. Recite and mime the rhyme.
- 4. Encourage the children to do the gestures with you.

Nursery Rhyme

- Head and shoulders, knees and toes (Touch each of the parts mentioned.)
- God knows me from head to toe (Point to the sky, then touch your head, then your feet.)
- He knows everything I need
 (Point to the sky at "he"
 then your head to "knows,"
 spread your arms to "everything"
 point at you at "I need" and put your arms in front of you, elbows bent and palms facing upward, fold your fingers on the palms to "need".)
- I need to be protected (Yell out this last line.)



The Heart of the Father

& Prayer

Noah is an example of faith and trust in God for all of us. God asked Noah to build a boat, a huge boat, a very, very large boat, big enough to put a lot of animals in. Noah took several years to build it. Why do you think Noah didn't give up along the way? There may be several reasons, but one of the reasons is that Noah knew his God and knew that God always honored his promises. When Noah entered the boat with the animals and his family, the rain began to fall on the earth and



for 40 days it no longer stopped. That's a long time, 40 days taken in a boat with animals and water all around you! But Noah trusted God and knew that his God was honoring his promises and that one day the rain would stop and that they could all get out of the boat. God promised Noah things and he did them.

The promises that the Father makes to you, he will fulfill them too. Even if it takes time, you must have faith, hope and trust in God. You may be in a difficult situation right now and you're thinking, "It's never going to get better." Always remember that the Father is a perfect father and that he is not a man to lie. He always honors his promises.

Craft

The Sign Of A Promise

Material

- Cloud Template (attachment)
- Coloured paper
- Glue
- Serrated scissors
- Scissors
- Markers

Steps

- 1. Print the attachment. Make sure you have enough clouds for each child.
- 2. Ask the kids to cut their cloud and colour it.
- 3. Ask them to cut thin strips of coloured paper.
- 4. Ask them to glue these strips behind the cloud and then let it dry.





5. Finally, ask them to cut the base of the strips with the serrated scissors.

Activity

Find The Pair

Material

Pictures of different animals

Steps

- 1. Cut the pictures of animals in half.
- 2. Scatter the pictures on a table or on the floor.
- 3. Ask the kids to find the two animal halves.
- 4. Make the connection with the story.

Physical Activity

Noah, Doves And An Olive Branch

Material

Pictures of an olive branch

Steps

- Place the children in a circle. Designate 1 child as Noah. The others will all be doves. Ask the doves
 to close their eyes while Noah goes to hide the pictures of olive branches in your room. He will
 certainly need help.
- 2. Come back to the circle and ask Noah to say, "Come on, fly and bring me an olive branch." The doves go in search of the pictures. When they have one, they have to go back to the circle.
- 3. Ask the children to close their eyes, designate a new Noah who will, in turn, hide the pictures of olive branches.
- 4. Repeat this game as many times as you want.





Snack

Noah's Ark

Material

- Banana (one per child)
- Animal-shaped cookies (4 per child)
- Icing (beware of allergies)
- Plates
- Paper towels

Steps

- 1. Give each child a banana.
- 2. Ask them to spread icing on the banana.
- 3. Finally, ask them to place animal-shaped cookies on the icing.
- 4. It's Noah's Ark.
