Find wisdom

Material

- 3D letters (beads, magnets, etc.)
- Spoon
- Bowl



Steps

1. Place 3D letters (beads, magnets, etc.) in a bowl.
2. Use a spoon to find the letters of the word wisdom. Remind the children that the Queen of Sheba went to seek wisdom.

Object Lesson

Do you listen to wisdom?

Material

- String
- Stapler
- Index card





- A size #64 elastic
- Two pencil erasers
- Punch
- Popsicle stick
- Watch example on YouTube

Steps

1. Use the hole puncher and make a hole in one end of the popsicle stick.
2. Pass the string through the hole and tie it securely.
3. Use the stapler to attach the string to the popsicle stick to prevent it from coming loose.
4. Write wisdom on the index card.
5. Center the short side of the index card on the popsicle stick.
6. Use three staples to attach the index card to the popsicle stick.
7. Place a pencil eraser on each end of the popsicle stick.
8. Stretch the rubber band over the stick so that it wraps around each pencil eraser.
9. Make sure you have a clear area to rotate the device.
10. Rotate the device slowly until you hear a buzzing sound.
11. You may need to adjust the speed at which you spin the device for it to start humming.

Application

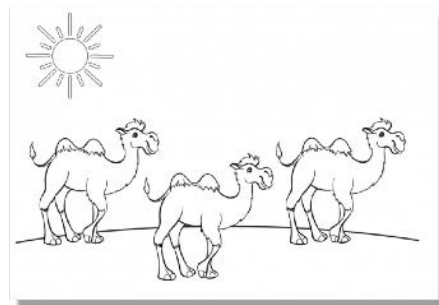
1. Tell the children your personal stories of wisdom. Tell them about situations where you were at an impasse and how the wisdom of the Father came to help you.
2. They need to hear about the actions of the Father in your life.

Craft

The Queen of Sheba is coming!

Material

- Coloring sheet (attachment)
- Coloring pencils
- Three felts in different shades of brown
- Black felt
- Scissors
- Glue
- DIY jewelry
- Construction paper



Steps

1. Before class, print out one coloring paper per child.
2. Have the children color the camels and then draw the Queen of Sheba on top of the first camel.



3. Tell the children to leave a small space between the queen and the camel.
4. Tell the children to cut out the first piece of felt in the shape of the first camel's back and then glue it on this one.
5. Ask them to cut out the second felt in the shape of the back of the second camel and glue it on the back of this one.
6. Tell them to then cut out the last piece of felt in the shape of the last camel and stick it on the camel's back.
7. Tell the children to cut a square out of the black felt and then cut a square hole in the black square.
8. Ask the children to stick this square on their paper so that the queen the children have drawn can be seen through the square. This will be the queen's carriage.
9. Tell the children to glue jewelry on the last camel's back.
10. Have the children cut out vase shapes from construction paper and glue them to the back of the second camel. It represents spices. You can also write the name of the spices on the vases.
11. Finally, tell the children to cut out rectangles from the construction paper and glue them to the first camel as other gifts from the queen to Solomon.

Activity

Try something new

Material

- Chopsticks
- Glasses
- Marshmallows



Steps

1. Give each child a glass and a pair of chopsticks.
2. Place all the small marshmallows on the table.
3. Ask the children to take the small marshmallows with their chopsticks in order to put them in their glass.
4. Make the connection with the story of the day. The Queen of Sheba came from another culture with different customs. Just as they are trying something from

another culture right now, the Queen of Sheba has come a long way to learn something new about Solomon.

Physical Activity

Long trips

Material

- Bins
- Materials (sand, jello, ketchup, soil, etc.)
- Towels
- Wipes



Steps

1. Before class, fill each bin with a different type of material (one bin per material).
2. Then create a path with all the bins.
3. Ask the children to take off their socks and walk on the path you have prepared. They will then have to drop their feet from one tray to another.
4. Place towels at the end of the path with wipes so kids can clean their feet without making too much of a mess.
5. Explain that the Queen of Sheba had to travel under different conditions to get to Solomon.

Snack

Camel in sight

Material

- Carrots
- Peas
- Broccoli
- Potato wedges (or parsnips)
- Cous cous
- Plates



Steps

1. Before class, cut a carrot into a semicircle to create a base of the body connected to a long rectangle as a neck and an oval connected to the neck to make a head.
2. Finish cutting the carrot by making small triangles for the ears.



3. Cut the potato wedges into thinner rectangles to form the legs and tail.
4. Cut more carrots into a triangle to create the camel's feet.
5. Also cut the broccoli.
6. Give each child a plate.
7. Distribute the carrot pieces and ask the children to arrange them on their plate to form a camel as in the photo.
8. Distribute the broccoli and tell the children to place them on top of the body to create the bumps.
9. Distribute the peas and tell them to place one on the head to make the camel's eye.
10. Place couscous on the plates near the camel's feet to create sand for a dessert.
11. Here ! The children all have a camel on which the queen of Sheba could have traveled.
